Think about your daily life and the places where you play, shop, and spend time. Discuss these with family and friends to help inform the CPA process.

Gather materials and 2-3 friends or family members.

Materials: Markers, post-it notes, flip chart (if available, not necessary). Pass out at least six post-its to each person, along with a writing utensil.

If possible ask everyone to pull up a map of the area of interest (on their phones). This step is helpful but not necessary.

Discuss the Places You Love

Prompt: Think about your daily life and the places where you play, shop, and spend time. What are the places you love? What qualities make these spaces unique and loveable?

Instructions: Spend 3-5 minutes writing places that you think of on post-it notes - one per post-it note.



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Discuss the Places That Need Love

Prompt: What are some places that you thought of that didn't make the first list? What qualities would make these spaces unique and loveable? What type of love do they need?

Instructions: Spend 3-5 minutes writing places that you think of on post-it notes - one per post-it note.

Organize the responses on a chart or wall and discuss.

Instructions: Use two flip charts or designate two areas on a wall or table - one for "Places We Love" and one for "Places that Need Love." If using a wall or table, you can use a post-it to label the areas.

Ask the group for help putting similiar places together in clusters, rows, or columns.

Organize and document the responses

Once the discussion is done, please write down the answers in a list format as follows:

- 1. Photograph the rings with the post-it notes.
- 2. Write down answers for "Places We Love."
- 3. Write down answers for "Places That Need Love."
- 4. Any differences/similarities among the places or recurring themes from the discussion.
- 5. Write down a description of any other insights from the group discussions.
